Every Child Ready to Read Skill

Reading

Babies: High contrast books or books with different textures are a great way to introduce your baby to reading.

Toddlers: Reading somewhere silly or special can make it exciting and fun. Try under the dining room table, the bathtub, or mom and dad's bed.

Preschoolers: Getting books on topics they like, such as dinosaurs or space, can encourage a love of reading. Reading can also be used to prepare for new experiences such as travel or going to school.

Resource Shoutout



Head Start is an income-based early child development and preschool program with full-day pre-k classes. Head Start increases the school readiness of children ages 3 to 4 years old.

Head Start encourages families to apply January through May prior to the start of the school year but accepts applications throughout the year.
