Please don't take my monster away!

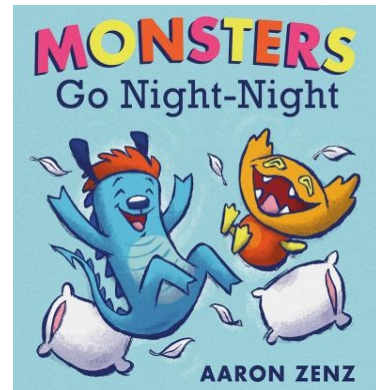
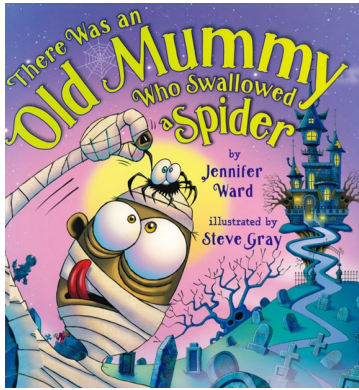
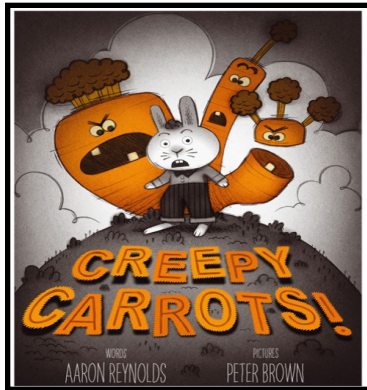
