*And I'd slip under the door.*



And dried up all the rain,



And the itsy-bitsy spider

Climbed up the spout again!



Singing helps preschoolers develop phonological awareness. Phonological awareness includes skills like segmenting a sentence into words and identifying the syllables in a word.

Enunciate while singing your child's favorite songs. For example, during the "L, M, N, O, P" portion of the alphabet song, put distinct pauses between each letter.
